The additions and renovations to North and South High Schools were the first major physical education, athletic, and community-use improvements to Sheboygan, Wisconsin's two 9th-12th grade high schools since their construction in the 1960s.

Each high school received a new gymnasium with a 160-meter indoor track facility that can accommodate four gym classes simultaneously. The new gymnasiums each have seating for approximately 2,800 spectators. Both projects included four locker rooms—two team locker rooms and two that serve as community locker rooms. North High included 111,057 square feet of new construction, renovation and finish upgrades costing \$12.9 million.

Also, each school's addition included new cafeteria/commons with elevated performance platforms, concession rooms, school stores, serving kitchens and server areas, and out-of-season coaches offices.

The existing cafeteria areas in both schools were renovated into weight/cardio/aerobic rooms (approximately 10,000 square feet each) and were partially outfitted with funds the District obtained from a Federal PEP Grant.

A renewed focus on life-long fitness was a major focus of this project. Providing students as well community members with access to cardiovascular and weight equipment, gymnasium facilities, and health training programs.
